Big Idea: An Inside Out Faith is a whole-hearted commitment to Jesus that is lived out in our attitudes, words and actions.

Intro Activity: Find two things in your home that you can turn inside out. What looks the funniest? Can you guess what other people's items are when they are inside out?

Bible Reading:

James 1:1-8 (NIV)

¹ James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ,

To the twelve tribes scattered among the nations: Greetings.

² Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, ³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. ⁴ Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. ⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. ⁶ But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. ⁷ That person should not expect to receive anything from the Lord. ⁸ Such a person is double-minded and unstable in all they do.

Discussion questions:

1. Naomi talked about two different kinds of faith, do you remember what they were? What does it mean to live with an 'inside out faith?





2. What happens to people with 'inside out faith' when hard times (trials) come?
3. How can you live with Inside Out Faith this week?
Pray about what we have learned together.
Activity: Balancing challenge. This week's challenge is taking a photo of yourself balancing on something with a book on your head. There is a lack of tightropes and wheelbarrows so we need to find other things to balance on.

You could do a balancing challenge during your time together:

- How many people can balance on one leg for 20 seconds?
- Can you balance on one leg and pat your head?
- Can you balance on one leg and pat your head and rub your tummy?
- Can you turn around three times and then balance on one leg for 20 seconds without falling over?

Big Idea: Living with an inside out takes perseverance but Jesus is worth it.

Intro Activity: Trick shots (you need a ball that will bounce and a cup/bin/bowl it will fit into).

Bible Reading:

James 1:12-18

¹² Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him.

¹³ When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; ¹⁴ but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed.¹⁵ Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.

¹⁶ Don't be deceived, my dear brothers and sisters.¹⁷ Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. ¹⁸ He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of first fruits of all he created.

Discussion questions:

1. What kinds of hard times (trials and testings) might a Christian go through?





2. What do Christians look forward to that helps them to persevere?



3. Look at verse 17, how does that help us to keep persevering through hard times?

Pray: Talk to God about what you have learned. Ask for his help to keep trusting him in hard times.

Bible Reading:

James 1:22-25 (NIV)

²² Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵ But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

Discussion questions:

1. James says in verse 22 to not just listen to the word but do what it says. What is the 'word' he is talking about?





2. Just like looking in a mirror, the Word of truth shows us what we really look like, and what we need? When we hear the gospel message (that we need Jesus to save us), how could we respond?
3. Look at verse 25, what does James say about the person who looks and responds rightly?
Remember the wonderful gospel message; God loves you and sent Jesus to rescue you. He promises that every time you confess you've done the wrong thing and turn away from it (that's repentance) then he will forgive you (check it out for yourself in 1 John 1:9). We don't need to hide our sin because we know God promises to forgive us.
Thank God for his forgiveness and ask for his help in being people who love to read and obey his words to us in the Bible.

Big Idea: A faith that is lived out takes action!

Intro Activity: Would you rather?

Bible Reading:

James 2:14-17 (NIV)

¹⁴ What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? ¹⁵ Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.

Discussion questions:

1. What kind of faith is like a dead chicken?

2. What might people do to show their faith is alive?





3. What can you do to live your faith out this week?
Pray : Ask God to help you live with 'Inside Out Faith' this week.
Weekly Challenge: The weekly challenge this week is to write a postcard to a child in another church group. Your leader will provide the name and address. Pop it in the post and wait to see when a postcard arrives for you!
Activity: I Spy! This works just like the usual 'I Spy' game but you need to be able to see the item being 'spied' on the screen (i.e., in the background of one of the people in the Zoom).

Intro Activity: Tongue Twisters! How twisty is your tongue? Try saying these as fast as you can.

Bible Reading:

James 3:1-12 (NIV)

¹Not many of you should become teachers, my fellow believers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly. ² We all stumble in many ways. Anyone who is never at fault in what they say is perfect, able to keep their whole body in check.

³ When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. ⁴ Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. ⁵ Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. ⁶ The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body, sets the whole course of one's life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell.

⁷ All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and sea creatures are being tamed and have been tamed by mankind, ⁸ but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.

⁹ With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God's likeness. ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be. ¹¹ Can both fresh water and salt water flow from the same spring? ¹² My brothers and sisters, can a fig tree bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Neither can a salt spring produce fresh water.





Watch the Bible Talk from Naomi

Discussion questions:

1. Let's see how many animals we can think of that have been tamed. Why do you think it is impossible to tame the tongue?

2. How do our tongues set the direction for the rest of our body? Can you think of an example of a time when you have seen powerful words that changed things?

3. Look at Verses 9 and 10 again. How can we use our tongues the right way?

Remember, God loves you and sent Jesus to rescue you. He can change our hearts! He promises that every time you confess you've done the wrong thing and turn away from it (that's repentance) then he will forgive you (check it out for yourself in 1 John 1:9). We don't need to hide our sin because we know God promises to forgive us.

Pray about what you've learned today. Do you need to say sorry about bad words you've spoken? Do you need to ask for God's help in using your words the right way? God loves to hear our prayers.





Activity: Cookie Face.

Each person needs to have a cookie (oreos, jatz, monte carlos, almost anything will work). The cookie is balanced on a person's forehead and the aim is to move it from the forehead to the mouth using only facial muscles and gravity. Best played in two rounds so that some kids can watch others doing it. If there are plenty of cookies you can see how many they can get into their mouths in one minute rounds.

Intro Activity: Spot the Difference

Bible Reading:

James 3:13-18 (NIV)

¹³ Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom. ¹⁴ But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast about it or deny the truth. ¹⁵ Such "wisdom" does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶ For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice.

¹⁷ But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness.

Discussion questions:

1. James says there are two sources of wisdom for our lives, what are they? How can you tell the difference between them?





2. Where do we hear and see worldly wisdom?

3. Where do we hear and see heavenly wisdom? Can you think of a way that God is changing you to show more heavenly wisdom in your life?

Pray and ask God to help you grow in heavenly wisdom.

Weekly Challenge: If you're brave, have a go at putting mentos in a fizzy drink. Record it and post to the Facebook group.

Alternative challenge, tell us what you're learning from James. Either write something to post or record a short video. Remember, Adam and Ella will be watching.

Intro Activity: 60 Second Game

Bible Reading:

James 5:7-12 (NIV)

⁷ Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains. ⁸ You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near. ⁹ Don't grumble against one another, brothers and sisters, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door!

¹⁰ Brothers and sisters, as an example of patience in the face of suffering, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. ¹¹ As you know, we count as blessed those who have persevered. You have heard of Job's perseverance and have seen what the Lord finally brought about. The Lord is full of compassion and mercy.

¹² Above all, my brothers and sisters, do not swear—not by heaven or by earth or by anything else. All you need to say is a simple "Yes" or "No." Otherwise you will be condemned.

Discussion questions:

1. Think about a time when you had to wait for something. Was it easy or hard to wait? Why?





2. What does James say we are waiting for? Why is it worth waiting for?
3. How should we wait?


Option 2 – Record your group doing Aggressive Alpine Skiing together on Zoom and post to the Facebook group.
